4 Alternatives to Demonstrating Competency

Option 1




Remediation/Retest

 All students, Including students taking the AASCD must receive remediation and then retest prior to consideration of excussing a student from consequences of not "passing" state testing requirements.

Strongly Consider the 4 Alternatives

 If after remediation and retesting a student still does not score proficient or higher, consider the graduation competency alternatives available to all students prior to such an excusal





Option 1 is not just for Students in "Career Tech Education"

- $\mbox{\bf WebXams}$ are the only competency measure that requires a student to be enrolled in a CTE program

- Apprenticeum

 An internship

 An internship is a temporary position with an emphasis on on-the-job training rather than merety employment.

 Youth-Pre Apprenticeship

 The Youth-Pre Apprenticeship program is a collaborative partnership between a school and registered apprenticeship sponsor that provides students with exposure to the work environment.

 Pre-Apprenticeship

 The Pre-Apprenticeship program teaches basic technical and job-readiness skills for a designated apprentice occupation

 Apprenticeship

 Apprenticeship is a combination of on-the-job training and related technical instruction. A student must be at least 16 years of age except where a higher minimum age standard is required by law. State law requires, beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, each district and community school to comply with an Ohio Department of Education-developed framework for issuing credit for work-based learning. Each district and community school also shall review any policy it has adopted regarding the demonstration of subject area competency to identify ways to incorporate work-based learning experiences, internships and cooperative education into the policy to increase student engagement and opportunities to earn units of high school credit





OMJ Readiness Seal can be used for Alternative Option 1 of the Competency Requirement as well as one of the Ohio designed Readiness Seals (double dipping is allowed).

ODE's OMJ Readiness Seal Page







- Must Earn at least 2 Diploma Seals
- Seals should align with students goals, interests and plans after graduation
- plans after graduation

 One of the two seals must be from the Ohio Designed Choices.
- OMJ Seal can be used for both Competency and Readiness Requirements

Transfer Students

- Required to take Algebra I and English II EOC exams, as well as any other EOC exams that Ohio public school students take.
 Transfer students who are seniors and do not score proficient or higher are exempt from the remediation/retake requirement.
 Must earn 2 diploma seals, one of which must be Ohio designed. See Summary of Graduation Updates on ODEs Websites for flowibility for transfer students with exempt of the diploma seals. flexibility for transfer students with several of the diploma seals.

 Districts must create guidelines to give students who transfer a

proportional amount of credit for any progress made toward completing locally defined seals.

Graduation Planning at a Glance

- Graduation Plans create relevancy for high school coursework, increase options for attainment of diploma, and prepares students for successful post-secondary outcomes

Graduation Plans: The Timeline

All schools were required to have a Graduation Plan policy in place as of September 30, 2020 (HB 166)

Key Elements of Graduation Planning

Why Create Graduation Plans?

- ☐ To ensure each student has a graduation pathway; Used as a process to
- document progress in high school and determine if a student is at risk for not graduating

What is a Graduation Plan?

☐ Graduation Plans are a required Universal Level level of support (tier 1) for all students Grades 9-12

Graduation Plans...

- □ Supplement (but <u>not</u> replace) Career Advising Policy. Student Success Plans, and IEP, and Transition Plans
- These additional plans need to be completed for the appropriate students

Annual Review of Graduation Plans

- All Graduation Plans must be reviewed and updated annually with in collaboration with the student.
- Families must be invited to develop and review the plan annualty
- The purpose of the review is to monitor progress, make adjustments, and/or consider support and/or intervention as necessary

- ☐ Develop plans for every student grades 9-12
- Develop criteria and procedures for identifying students who are at-risk for not qualifying for a high school diploma.
- Develop a notification process in which the district or school will notify an at-risk student's parent, guardian or caregiver in each year that the student has been identified as being at risk for not graduating.

Graduation Plans do not Replace Student Success Plans or IEPs

Students at risk of not graduating will receive a Student Success Plan A student's IEP may serve as a student's Graduation Plan <u>enty</u> if the IEP contains academic goals 'substantively similar' to the requirements of

a Graduation Plan

Not all students who are on IEPs are "At Risk" of not graduating and in need of a Student Success Plan (and vice-versa), but <u>ALL</u> students get graduation plans!
