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

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The Expanding Expressions Tool is a multisensory ELA tool designed to help students develop a system for spoken and written language. Tool creator Sara Smith will join us virtually as we learn how this tool can help students from preschool to grade 12 with oral language expression, written language expression, vocabulary, and comprehension.

This tool can be used for general descriptions, writing from prior knowledge, autobiographies/biographies, summarizing and more.

The Expanding Expression Tool (EET) helps to build the following language skills:

- Oral expression
- Written expression
- Vocabulary comprehension
- Defining and describing
- Making associations
- Stating functions of objects
- Categorization
- Similarities and differences
- Students quickly learn each symbol and consistently describe and define objects and items providing 6-7 details in an organized manner.
- It allows students to quickly progress from word to phrase to paragraph to multi-paragraph levels.

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Just as CPR helps those without clinical training assist an individual having a heart attack, Mental Health First Aid prepares participants to interact with a person experiencing a mental health crisis. Mental Health First Aiders learn a fivestep action plan that guides them through the process of reaching out and offering appropriate support.

This 5-hour training is designed to teach adults who work with

young people how to help a youth who is experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crisis. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations.

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
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Calling all 3-12 educators looking to create authentic meaningful partnerships to better prepare students for a successful future!



August 4, 2025 - August 8, 2025

Teacher CAMP is a week-long, immersive experience for teachers of grades 3-12. Participants will explore in-demand occupations by visiting and meeting with local business and industry partners. Teachers will develop authentic curriculum-connected activities to take back to the classroom. A professional learning community and shared resources will provide additional support throughout the school year.

#### PROGRAM FAST FACTS

- August 4 8, 2025. Daily attendance is required.
- Daily hours are 8:30 am 4:00 pm.
- Main location is the ESCLEW.
- 35 contact hours OR 3 graduate credit hours are available upon program completion.
- Upon acceptance, the cost is \$100 for ESCLEW affiliated schools (Maumee, Perrysburg, Rossford, Springfield, Sylvania, Washington Local, and ESCLEW sponsored Community Schools). The cost is \$125 for all other participants.

#### MORE DETAILS

- The workshop will focus on in-demand business and industry needs in healthcare, manufacturing, hospitality, and construction with on-site visits and of expert speakers.
- Collegial collaboration is embedded in the Teacher CAMP experience.
- Participants are responsible for their own transportation to site visits. All site visits are local.
- Application deadline is March 30, 2025. Applicants will be notified of acceptance by April 15, 2025.
