



Where are your TBTs?

- 1. Unpacking standards to identify and agree on important learning outcomes.
- 2. Developing and using shared Formative Assessments.
- 3. Agreeing on a shared Instructional Practice.



TBT/BLT Communication

- BLT members were unclear on instructional practices in their TBTs.
 - BLTs need to know what practices TBTs are working on and are finding effective.
 - BLTs need to share effective practices across the school.
 - What teaching practices should they focus on?

TBT/BLT Communication

- Use of common forms and language
 - o TBT/BLT 5-Step Process Meeting Agenda and Minutes Template
 - o TBT/BLT Communication Log
 - o TBT to BLT Protocol & Feedback
- Make a TBT/BLT Meeting calendar before school starts
- Make sharing and talking about data apart of the school culture
- As a BLT Monitor the data, but also act upon the data.

Your BLT should be able to answer the BIG Inquiry Questions.

- Is your school making progress?
 - How do you know?
 - Do you know why?

Is Your BLT Making Progress?

If you are not making progress...

- How and When do you know?
- Do you know Why?

- Participate in common training with your BLT if needed.
- Collaboratively develop goals with your BLT. Monitor and revise as needed.
